## BMVF Grant Supports Local Charities with Funds to Meet Immediate Social Challenges

We asked local organizations to send us one-page grant requests that included how they were mobilizing to address these key issues, creative approaches used to meet the challenges, and collaborations and partnerships they were implementing to magnify impact.
